TECH TIP OF THE MONTH

Use OneDrive Links Instead of Email Attachments

We've all seen it: Final, Final-v2, Actually-Final... Sound familiar? Instead of emailing file attachments, try sharing a **OneDrive link**. That way, everyone is working from the **same up-to-date file**, with no confusion over versions.

Why it helps:

- Changes show up instantly for everyone
- No more inbox clutter from large attachments

- You can control (or remove) access at any time

Quick tip:

Save the file to OneDrive, click **Share**, and paste the link into your email or Teams message.

It's a small habit change that can make collaboration a whole lot smoother.
