Stay Secure on Public Wi-Fi This Summer

Whether you're working from an airport, hotel, coffee shop, or conference center, public Wi-Fi networks can be convenient—but they also come with risks.

Cybercriminals often target public networks because they know people may be accessing email, banking information, business applications, and other sensitive data while on the go.

Here are a few simple ways to stay protected:

Verify the network before connecting. Always confirm the correct Wi-Fi name with staff. Attackers sometimes create fake networks with names that look legitimate to trick users into connecting.



Avoid accessing sensitive information on public Wi-Fi.

If possible, wait until you're on a trusted network before accessing financial accounts, company systems, or other confidential information.

Use a VPN when traveling.

A Virtual Private Network (VPN) encrypts your internet traffic, helping protect your data from prying eyes on public networks.

Keep your devices updated.

Software updates often include important security patches that help protect against newly discovered threats.

Turn off automatic Wi-Fi connections.

Many devices automatically reconnect to previously used networks. Disabling this feature helps prevent accidental connections to potentially unsafe networks.

Quick Takeaway

Public Wi-Fi isn't inherently dangerous, but it should never be treated the same as your home or office network. A little caution can go a long way toward protecting your personal and business information while you're on the move.

The following is a shortened excerpt from this quarter's edition of Pillar Magazine, where we explore how businesses can responsibly embrace artificial intelligence while maintaining accountability, security, and human oversight.

The Leader's Advantage in an AI World

Business leaders are constantly being pulled in different directions. Between handling urgent client requests, solving staffing or operations issues, reviewing policies and keeping the organization moving forward, there is rarely enough time in the day. In our Q2 Pillar magazine, Reyna Monson explores how AI can help leaders work with more clarity, confidence and impact.

The article emphasizes that AI is not a replacement for leadership. Business owners and decision-makers still bring the context, culture, values and judgment that technology cannot replicate. However, AI can be a powerful tool for making smart people even more effective. When used thoughtfully, it can help leaders save time, organize their thinking and make better-informed decisions.

Reyna shares several practical examples from her own experience, including using AI to help review IT and security policies against compliance requirements, brainstorm and evaluate potential names for this magazine, and serve as a sounding board for larger business questions. In each case, AI helped speed up the process, but human oversight remained essential. The strongest results came from giving AI clear direction, adding context, refining the prompts and carefully reviewing the output.

The biggest takeaway is that AI is not a shortcut around good leadership. It demands clearer questions, stronger thinking and careful judgment. But when leaders use it intentionally, AI can multiply what they are able to accomplish, helping them spend less time buried in daily fire drills and more time focused on strategy, growth and the future of their business.
